
On March 10, 1959, we received a message at Madison High School that made our hearts heavy—mortal life was over for Mrs. Wilna Marshall Alexander.

She possessed a fine perspective and taught her pupils that all material things are of value only so long as they build lasting spiritual values.


Indeed her life exemplified the simple counsel of the Prophet Micah: "To do justly, to love mercy, and to walk humbly with thy God."

She has directed the mending staff 4 years, trained 8th graders two years, has planned and directed all activities of the LIBRARY LASSIES, served on the committee to interview applicants and writes two book reviews for each issue of the RAM-PAGE. PEGGY WILLIAMS, secretary, has worked 4 years. She directed the work at the circulation desk two years, worked on the mending staff 2 years and trained 8th grade workers 2 years, and served on the committee to interview new applicants. The high point of the year was the induction service for new members held on March 5th. Printed invitations were sent to parents and other guests. Mrs. H. H. Brockette, Director of Instructional Materials for Davidson County, was the guest speaker. The thirteen charter members administered an impressive ceremony to the thirteen new members after which Mrs. Wiley distributed the newly adopted membership cards. To be a Library Lassie one must be in good standing as a student library worker, attend at least three-fourths of the regular meetings and participate in at least one of the major projects sponsored by the group.

The adopted symbols of the Lassies are the plaid clad lassie, the open book, and a burning candle. The plaid represents frugality which all Lassies must practice with their time in order to help others more. The open book is for knowledge and the burning candle the spreading of knowledge. Each Lassie pledges:

"I solemnly pledge myself to give my fellow students, this school and its library my utmost services as a member of the Library Lassies. I will be loyal to this group, its purposes, its standards and its activities. I will show proper respect to its leaders both student and teacher and to all those I strive to aid. I realize that the spreading of the light of wisdom, knowledge and brotherhood, is my greatest duty, privilege and reward."







This year the Rams lose only Smith and Guard Ira Frye from the starting five. Although they leave key positions to be filled, next year's squad should be better balanced and more experienced.
