
Dedication

N. F. L. Trains Leaders

The National Forensic League of Madison High School is the fastest growing chapter in the state and has been so for the past four years. Our chapter was represented in the state finals last year. We have placed first in county competition for the last two years and are well on the way to winning for 1961.

Membership in our chapter is based on scholarship, leadership, good character, and forensic ability. The purpose is not to confer membership on all who have taken some part in forensic work, but to honor with membership those who have demonstrated ability and perseverance. It sets a standard of achievement, welcoming to membership those who reach that standard and encouraging others to reach it.

The emblem of our organization is shaped like a key, symbolizing the unlocking and feeling of the powers of expression and personality. Our colors of red, white, and blue are very meaningful: red, a symbol of the courage it takes to be a leader and to uphold the things that are right and just: white, a symbol of truth; blue, a symbol of the loyalty which the members owe to their home, school, and their chapter.

During this school year, three of our members will receive Special Recognition for attaining at least 500 forensic points. This is the highest honor an NFL member can achieve. Ann-Ellen Pigue and Linda Jo Castelow rank in the top 100 forensic students in the Nation, and Elaine Coleman will reach this group before the year ends.

Among these are the associations' pin awareded for the first time in 1960, an annual Newsletter and a scrap book contest to present the library program of each school. At the annual conference in the spring a revolving trophy is presented the school with the best program as pictured through the scrapbook.

Anne Williams, president, edited the first Newsletter which was distributed to all member schools. It was developed as a Library Lassie project with each member participating under Anne's direction. Cheryl Boyd edited the first scrapbook which won in the competition and the Lassies are the first group to win the trophy in recognition of their school library program.

On March 2 the annual Induction Service was held for 20 new members with Mr. Charles Brown of the Davidson County Board of Education as the guest speaker. Printed invitations were mailed to 100 guests. Fifteen experienced workers received their membership cards and four Lassies received their Middle Tennessee Association of Student Library Assistant's pins.

To earn a pin each Lassie must: work in the library at least two years, attend three-fourths of the regular weekly meetings, participate in four club projects, and have a complete understanding of the constitution. Seven Lassies have earned pins.


